Blackhawk Ave. residents: do you want traffic islands?

As mentioned at the last neighborhood meeting, traffic calming islands have been proposed for a section of Blackhawk Ave. Households along that street can expect to receive an opinion survey from the City's Traffic Engineering agency, with results from that survey authorizing or dismissing the proposal.

While final details aren't yet known, Traffic Engineering may break the islands plan into two distinct proposals, one covering the block from Regent to Bluff, and another covering the lesser trafficked blocks north of Bluff. The City will install traffic islands if 60% of the returned surveys indicate favor, so please keep an eye out for and respond to the surveys.






