SVCA Yahoo! Group

You may have noticed that Sunset Village has an Online Message Board, otherwise known as a "listserv" or "electronic mailing list." The Sunset Village online message board is a Yahoo! Group called "sunsetvillagecommunityassociation." If you join this group you may send and receive email messages on neighborhood topics such as newsletter deadlines, crime reports, Hoyt Plan meetings, roofing company queries, lost cats, block parties, and so on.

Join the SVCA Yahoo! Group on the Sunset Village Community Association website: www. sunsetvillagecommunity.org/. Go to the bottom right of the web page and click on "SVCA Yahoo! Group" to bring up the Yahoo! Group web page, where you will be able to read messages posted to the group. To post messages and receive them to your email account, click on "Join This Group!;" you will have to "Create New Account" if you don't already have a Yahoo account.

To further tweak your Yahoo! Group account you may "Edit Membership" and choose whether to receive each group message to your email address, get a Daily Digest of postings, or opt only to check postings when you go to the Yahoo! Group website. Typically SVCA postings have been low volume and not likely to clutter your Inbox. The Online Message Board is a good way to share information between newsletter issues and quarterly meetings, so do join.

Refuse Cart Locations and the Municipal Code

Several months ago a neighbor's warning citation for front yard storage of their refuse and recycling carts prompted a request to City of Madison Building Inspection for the ordinance or policy that dictates placement of these carts for residential users. The response came from Marla Rauls, Property Code Inspector, Dept of Planning & Development, Building Inspection Unit, who gave the source as Madison General Ordinances, Chapter 7 - Public Health.

MGO 7.36 (7)(b) "Placing of Garbage Containers. Garbage containers or vessels shall be kept in the rear of the house or buildings..."

The Madison General Ordinances do not make reference to the tan and green carts currently in use and do not refer, in this section, to rubbish or recycling.

MGO 7.36 (1) "Definition. The word 'garbage' as used in this section shall be held to include any refuse accumulation of animal or vegetable matter that attends the preparation, use, or cooking of meats, fish, fowl, fruits, and vegetables..."

City of Madison Streets and Recycling web site does not have guidelines for storage of refuse carts. You can find that at the Building Inspection website (www.cityofmadison.com/dpced/bi/trash-recycling:-removal-of-bins-storage/44/), which refers to MGO 7.36: "Trash and recycling containers shall be stored at the rear of the building." You may also read the "Exterior Property Enforcement Guide" downloadable from this web site.

Many Sunset Village residents don't have an easy way to get their carts into small garages or to the rear of their houses, especially through winter snow and ice and hilly side yards. Fortunately the City does not have a policy of citing homeowners for placement of carts unless Building Inspection receives a complaint.

Emerald Ash Borer Website

The City of Madison Forestry Section has updated its Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) website. There are two new features on the website:

- Residents can email the Forestry Section directly to report a suspected EAB sighting. If you don't know what to look for the website has information about the pest and images to help you identify the Emerald Ash Borer.
- Residents can enter their street address to find out if there is an ash street tree planted in front of their home or within the neighborhood www. cityofmadison.com/parks/services/forestry/pests/ EAB/lookup.cfm

As of September 2012 there has been no confirmed sighting of EAB in Dane County. For more information contact City of Madison Forestry at 608-266-4816. Each aldermanic district has its own EAB susceptible tree map.

SAIL - Supporting Active Independent Lives

At our last quarterly meeting SVCA resident Tom Popp called attention to the SAIL program here in the Madison area. SAIL, which stands for Supporting Active Independent Lives, is a non-profit membership organization of people 55+ who live in Madison/Dane County and wish to remain in their homes. SAIL provides access to prescreened service providers to help around your home. These include handymen, yard care professionals, electricians, plumbers, window washers, etc. SAIL also provides referrals to community resources, a daily automated check-in service, house checks, wellness services, social events and clubs, member-helping-member volunteer opportunities, discounts to MSCR and SAIL S.O.S. (a local emergency response service), and even quarterly mattress flipping.

Some of the community organizations SAIL works with are: West Madison Senior Coalition, Monona Senior Center, Dane County Health and Human Services, Safe Communities, Caregiver Program of Area Agency on Aging, and more. SAIL members take an active role in driving the program; a group of members, the Connections Group, meets monthly to

create SAIL programs, tweak current services, and provide the governing board with on-going recommendations. SAIL offers many volunteer opportunities including committee work, public relations, visitation/companionship, member transportation, office assistance.
