City of Madison Redistricting Will Put Sunset Village in Alder District #5

What is Redistricting?

Redistricting is the process of adjusting voting districts based on population changes between the Federal Government's decennial censuses. The City of Madison's process of redrawing alder districts is based on population changes between the 2010 and 2020 Census. For the City of Madison and its residents, this means adjusting ward and alder districts to balance city population growth so each resident has equal representation on the Common Council.

The City has created an Ad Hoc Redistricting Committee, comprised of four Alders and three residents, to lead the redistricting process. Following criteria outlined in State law, the Committee will develop an updated ward and alder district map to submit to Common Council for approval.

Redistricting Criteria

In addition to equalizing population, the Ad Hoc Redistricting Committee will be redrawing alder district boundaries using the four following criteria, which are required by State and Federal law:

- Districts must enhance the participation of communities of color and communities that primarily use a language other than English.
- Districts must be compact.
- Districts must be contiguous.
- Districts must account for Communities of Interest (COIs).
 - Neighborhoods and neighborhood associations
 - Elementary school attendance areas
 - College students
 - Housing tenure/transience
 - Income distribution

Through redistricting, Madison will do 3 things:

- 1. Reconfigure the 20 alder districts so they contain an equal number of residents (targeted at 13,739).
- 2. Split wards that have over 4,000 people and combine some wards that have fewer than 1,000 people.
- 3. Establish polling places based on the reconfigured ward map.

As of this writing, the Ad Hoc Redistricting Committee is favoring Alder District Concept 7a. If Concept 7a is adopted, Sunset Village Community Association would move from alder District 11 to District 5, with the exception of Hillcrest Drive and Merlham Drive on the west side of Midvale Boulevard, which would remain in District 11.

Sunset Village Neighborhood and Nearby Project Updates

Willow Creek Watershed Study

The purpose of the watershed study is to identify causes of existing flooding in the Willow Creek Watershed, and then look at potential solutions to try to reduce flooding. University Avenue 2022 Road Construction

City of Madison 9/24/2021 update: The Common Council approved the project on July 6, 2021, and the project team has continued to work on final design and planning. It has been determined that it will not be feasible to complete all of the construction work with this project in a single season, so construction on this project will be completed in the summer of 2023. The current construction schedule is to begin work in May of 2022 and complete all work on the northerly side, which will include the westbound travel lanes and sidewalk, the 96" storm sewer, the sanitary sewer interceptor line, and work on University Bay Dr., including the pedestrian/bike overpass structure. The area will then be restored and re-opened to all lanes of traffic for the winter. In 2023, work will consist of reconstructing the southern half of University Ave., which will include reconstructing the local sanitary sewer and water mains, the eastbound travel lanes and sidewalk. Let's Talk Streets Campaign Seeks Additional Input

City of Madison Department of Transportation 2021 initiative update on September 23, 2021: "The City of Madison has been connecting with members of the community to learn what is important to them when it comes to streets throughout the city. The goal is to create an equitable process to design and construct streets – including roadways, sidewalks, terrace trees, and everything in between – based on YOUR shared community values. We are now seeking additional input to ensure that we have heard you correctly."

Capital High School at Hoyt School Update

The Madison Common Council has unanimously rejected an appeal to the Plan Commission of siting Capital High at the Hoyt School building. Renovations will move forward as planned over the next two years, and Capital High, which is one of the Madison Metropolitan School District's two alternative high schools, will begin instruction at the site by fall 2023. The appeal, filed by 12 neighbors living within 200 feet of the school property, cited three concerns: (A) The uses, values and enjoyment of other property in the neighborhood for purposes already established will be substantially impaired or diminished; (B) Adequate access roads and parking supply, including but not limited to vehicular, pedestrian, bicycle and public transit are not being provided; (C) Transportation management measures have not been taken to provide adequate ingress and egress so as to minimize traffic congestion and to ensure public safety and adequate traffic flow on the public streets in the area. 






The Playing Field's New Sensory Play Path at Bethany

The Playing Field is a school for children ages 0-5 right here in Sunset Village. It enrolls private pay, scholarship, and Early Head Start kids of all races, including those who have and those who have not been affected by trauma and adverse childhood experiences. It has become a national model for how to address these issues – and how to benefit all children – through love and bonding, respect and safety for all, and a program called Conscious Discipline.

Recently The Playing Field designed and built a new Sensory Play Path to assist children in recognizing and coping with emotions. This Sensory Play Path is the first of its kind in the country. The stations of the path provide sensory input and lead the children in management of emotions, self-regulation, and resiliency. For more information, go to **playingfieldmadison.org**.

City Staff Find Cost-Saving Alternative – But No More Leaf Bales

As autumn begins, park visitors will begin to see pops of beautiful reds, oranges, and golds. One notable location is Forest Hill Cemetery, with its majestic oaks, maples, and other species forming shaded tunnels throughout the winding roads. While fall is especially beautiful and peaceful at the Cemetery, it is also a tremendous undertaking for staff to keep up and remove the many fallen leaves. For many years, staff used a baler to compact the leaves and provide leaf bales at no charge to the public. In the nearly 20 years of service, the baler was known to be finicky and would too frequently break down.

In November of 2020, the leaf baler sadly made its final run. With repair estimates at more than \$10K and replacement equipment near \$25K, Parks staff looked for an alternative solution and worked with the Streets Division to find a creative solution and an offer we could not refuse. Our good friends at Streets loaned Parks a leaf pan to use on the Parks packing truck, saving the Parks Division more than \$20,000. The pan, which installs in mere minutes, is typically used to collect leaves and yard waste. For Parks, it's not only a cost-savings but is also a more efficient method to move and remove the many fallen leaves in the Cemetery. This method does, however, eliminate the large leaf bales as the collected leaves are provided to locally-owned Purple Cow Organics, for composting.
